





YAZOO are a unique blend of Vince Clarke's bounding synthesiser pop and Genevieve Alison Moyet's warm bluesy voice that make sure the machines don't have it all their own way. In a couple of months they've brought a new passion to electronic music — 80's software for the heart and feet

It should never have worked ... Vince was fresh out of Depeche Mode with a stack of keyboards under his arm and their first three hits under his helt. He'd written "Dreaming Of Me", "New Life" and "Just Can't Get Enough". After some hard thinking he'd decided to try a solo career. He could have gone back to his previous professions but somehow there didn't seem to be the proper openings for a lorry-driver, wages clerk or civil servant and rather than sit around listening to his favourite Simon civil servant and rather than sit around listening to his favourite and Garfunkel albums, he filled his Basildon flat with several sea-going tankers worth of electronics and set to work.

Enter Alison or Alf, a nickname bestowed by her French father. She'd been trudging round the Southend/South Essex rhythm and blues gigs, leave the tonsils for countless bands including The Vicars and The flapping the tonsils for countless bands including the London circuit, she Screaming Abdabs. Fed up with not getting onto the London circuit, she advertised for 'a rootsy blues band' and what did she get ... Vince and his eight-storev fuse box.

The crazy thing was, she could have known more about the buttons to press than Vince. After an education at Nicholas Comprehensive School, also in Basildon and Southend Technical College, she'd gone on to study musical instrument technology at the London College of Furniture.

A single, supposedly a one-off to test the water, never stopped for a sandwich on its way up to number two in the British charts. That was "Only You" closely followed by the second single "Don't Go" and now an album "Upstairs at Eric's", produced by Yazoo and Eric Radcliffe with album "Upstairs at Eric's", produced by Hazoo and Eric Radcliffe with additional assistance from Daniel Miller on Mute Records, who also guided Depeche Mode to the top.

YAZOO have already shaken electronic pop by bringing back people. The album has even more surprises as they've been experimenting with Computers, tape loops and songwriting with Alf contributing some of the material including the moody "Winter Kills", the B Side of "Don't Go".

The next job is getting back to the stage. Instead of using backing tapes, the techno-team will be supported by their own micro-computer which will control drum sounds, synthesiser lines and a special slide show to augment the performance. From rhythm and blues to blues and the new rhythm.
