MUTE020 / 'Only You' / Poster / 1982 / Vince Clarke's first project after leaving Depeche Mode was Yazoo, a duo that he formed with fellow Basildon singer Alison Moyet. The poster for their debut single featured the silhouetted images from the record's sleeve.

MUTE020 / "Only You" / YAZ001 / "Don't Go" / YAZ002 / "The Other Side Of Love" / Covers / 1982 / Yazoo enjoyed immediate success, their first two singles becoming Top 3 UK hits. "Some of Yazoo's photography was by Joe Lyons, who also did a lot of work with Siouxsie and the Banshees around the same time."



By the time Yazoo had finished recording the album they were barely speaking, and announced their break-up before it was even released. It nonetheless topped the album charts.

STUMM12 / You And Me Both / Front / 1983 / The artwork for You And Me Both was conceived by 23 Envelope (graphic designer Vaughan Oliver and photographer Nigel Grierson). "Vaughan is well known for creating the visual identity for the 4AD label, but this was the only project he did for us. The image of two dogs fighting was unintentionally appropriate for the situation."
